



## Insect Pest Resistance Evolution A NIMBioS Investigative Workshop

November 14-15, 2013 NIMBioS at the Univ. of Tennessee, Knoxville

The goals of this workshop are to develop a modeling framework that can provide guidance on absolute time required for resistance to evolve in given systems and to aid in designing sustainable crop protection strategies through the investigation of resistance evolution across landscapes. The workshop will also synthesize the state of knowledge about resistance evolution, define focused research goals for both the theoretical and empirical community, foster greater connection between theory and application, and broaden the role of agricultural entomology in elucidating general phenomena in applied evolution. The workshop will bring together scientists with diverse backgrounds, including empirical entomologists, applied and basic modelers, geneticists, and government agency scientists familiar with regulatory goals.

Participation in the workshop is by application only. Individuals with a strong interest in the topic are encouraged to apply, and successful applicants will be notified within two weeks of the application deadline. If needed, financial support for travel, meals, and lodging is available for workshop attendees.
